

### **CHURCH USE POLICY UPDATE:**

The Human Resources Ministry has worked hard on updating the policy for use of the church facilities by members and nonmembers. At the July Council Meeting, the Church Council approved the new policy.

Please take note of some important changes:

- 1) To help defray costs to Central UCC (like electricity, gas, water, sewer, paper products, hand soap, etc.) members will be asked to pay when requesting use of the church for personal purposes (activities that are not Central UCC functions).
  
- 2) To secure a requested date(s) for use of a location in the church building, members and non-members will be asked to read the "Church Use Policy" and "Safe Church Policy", then complete the "Church Use Agreement" (at the back of the Church Use Policy). Once the agreement is completed, it should be turned in to the church office.
