

THE WESTMINSTER CATECHISM

What is the chief end of man?
Man’s chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever.

This version of a creed is from a catechism, specifically the Shorter Westminster Catechism. Written for a reformed denomination in

1647, the Presbyterians, of which one sub-denomination, the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. is in “Formula of Agreement” with the United Church of Christ, it has a counterpart in the Larger Westminster catechism. The difference is that the “Shorter” version was written for lay families to use as material to teach at home, often around the dinner table. The “Larger” version was for ministers. The purpose of both was to bridge the theological gap between the Presbyterians in Scotland and similar reformed congregations in England.

Surprisingly, the Shorter Westminster Catechism does not begin with God, Jesus, the Trinity, creation, or salvation. It begins with us, and why we are here, on earth. It bestows a dignity upon us, surpassing anything for which we might have hoped, and has been described as “audacious”.

Of all the catechisms, this is my favorite. We will look at the first question and answer each remaining Sunday in August.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM SAFE CHURCH COMMITTEE & WORSHIP COMMITTEE RE: WORSHIP IN THE SANCTUARY:

As we resume worshipping in the sanctuary, things will be done differently for the safety of all. We ask for your patience as we adjust to the new way of doing things. Things to remember are:

- Everyone's temperature will be taken before entering the building.
- Everyone must wear a mask. If you need a mask, we will have one available.
- **Practice social distancing of 6 feet.**
- No hand shaking or hugging.
- No lingering in aisles or building before and after the service.
- Ushers will assist with seating.
- Unrelated or persons not living in the same household should not ride together in the elevator.

Offering Baskets are located at the back of the sanctuary, and up front by the doors next to the chancel platform for you to place your offering envelopes.

We will hold a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, August 23, immediately following Church services to discuss the path forward for the Search and Call process. The Search and Call Committee has been pursuing ministerial applicants for nearly 2 years and has reviewed at least two dozen applicants without success. The Search Committee feels we need to make some clear decisions as a church to better define who we are and what we want from a minister. We may need to pursue other paths, such as the Evangelical Association, in order to find a minister who fits Central and what we need going forward.

August Festival of Sharing Kit: The Mission and Outreach Ministry will be collecting items for the Missouri Family Food Boxes during August. Please place items in the box in the narthex. Donated items must be exactly as below:

- 3 different cans of vegetables 14.5 oz. (one peas,
one green beans, one corn or carrots, other veggies)
- 3 cans tuna 5 oz.
- 3 pkgs. macaroni & cheese
- 3 different cans of fruit 14.5 oz. (one peaches, one pears,
one fruit cocktail, mandarin oranges or other fruit)
- 1 can pasta sauce
- 1 jar peanut butter
- 1 lb. pasta
- 3 cans chicken (tuna can size at Dollar General)
